



2015 MICA/CIMA REPORT

For 2015, we had 2790 individual participants, up from 2014 (2613), our largest ever. We also had 167 teams down just 13 from our highest last year of 180. The total number of countries was best ever at 14 up from 11 last year, with 10 in 2013, and 11 in 2012. The following table outlines the participation for the past 5 years.

This was the first year for para categories, we hope it will grow in the future!
